What a couple of months for the boat section!

February saw the **Victorian Masters** at Lorne. Gold for the Point Leo Platos Mens crew in the 220+ and Gold to the Lounge Lizards Mens crew in the 160+ to assist the Club again being declared the Champion club in Masters.

We then progressed through to the **ASRL Open** (Aust Surf Rowers League) held in Coffs Harbour. With some *9ft*+ surf on the beaches the event was moved to the harbour. With some solid rows both the Plato's in the Masters and the Mimosa's crew in the Reserve Grade Ladies section had semi final finishes. The event highlighted some additional work crews need to compete on the National stage. Great work by Higgi and Crombie in the transport.

Next was the **Vic State Titles** at Warrnambool. The Masters Crew (Platos) represented the club in the Open Boat race(and competed admirably). There were great results by our two Senior crews – Gold to the Mimosas Ladies crew in the Reserve Grade and Silver to the Lounge Lizards Mens crew in Reserve Grade. The boys were a bit stiff in the final considering they won all the heats and semi final in the lead up. Along with the rowing, the Mimosa crew also won Gold in the Lifesaver relay (this includes both boats and surfsports). A first Gold for Point Leo in this event ever. A massive result that shows the depth of talent across all sections / ages and genders of our club. So a great 'vibe' around the section and a massive thanks to all our sponsors and supporters. GANT, Absolute Surveying, Community Bank – Balnarring and District, Shoreham Surf, Grill'd and Bowser Bean.

All the focus is now on the Aussie Titles (North Kirra). With some great admin work by Kim Williams the Point Leo SLSC and the boat section has been strengthened with some further inclusions of additional Victorian crews that would have otherwise missed the opportunity to compete. The 2024/2025 Surf Sports season has been a highly successful and rewarding one for Point Leo SLSC. The Life Saving Victoria Senior State Titles were an amazing event for the club, and the results speak volumes about the depth of talent and hard work within our club. Point Leo achieved multiple top-six finishes across water, beach, and team events, with standout performances in:
